It also provides pupils with the opportunities to develop and extend their skills and to express their individual interests, thoughts and ideas. Art and Design – Implementation

To ensure the outstanding implementation of Art and Design, at Thwaites School, we have developed a comprehensive and carefully planned curriculum that offers a broad range of artistic experiences and opportunities for pupils across all year groups. They use a variety of teaching strategies, including whole-class teaching, group work, and individual support, to meet the needs of all pupils. Teachers model and scaffold techniques, and provide clear instructions and demonstrations to ensure pupils understand and can apply key artistic concepts. We encourage independent thinking and creativity, fostering a positive and supportive learning environment, celebrating effort, progress and achievement in art through displays, exhibitions and enrichment activities, such as trips to museums and galleries, and competitions.
